Focus on process and efficiency improvements

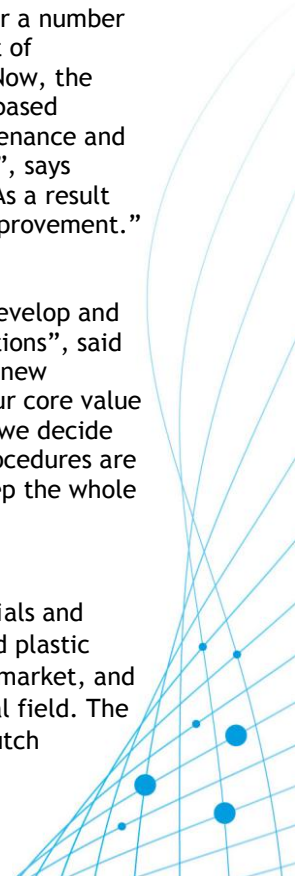
